**STAFF BACKGROUND:**

Teaching Staff = full time 6, part time 3; Support Staff = 7, (job share roles). Jireh School was established in 2001 as a private school serving the Christian community of Kumeu. In 2006 Jireh became a state integrated school with a Christian character as a satellite of KingsWay School in Orewa. The school is a Primary School Year 1 to 6. An application has been submitted to the Ministry of Education for a change of class to include Year 7 and 8.

**FACILITIES:**

The school has 8 teaching classrooms.

There are withdrawal spaces for small group teaching or remedial assistance, a science/technology/art, a hall, dance and drama room, interview room and office block, sick bay, two fields, a sports shed, a playground and sandpit. The facilities include the

use of a full sized gymnasium and auditorium.
