Jireh School was established in 2001 as a private school serving the Christian community of Kumeu. In 2006 Jireh became a state integrated school with a Christian character as a satellite of KingsWay School in Orewa. The school is a Primary School Year 1 to 6.

### FACILITIES:

The school has 7 teaching classrooms. There are withdrawal spaces for small group teaching or remedial assistance, a science/technology/arts room, a hall, interview room and office block, sick bay, two fields, a sports shed and a playground. The facilities include the use of a full sized gymnasium and auditorium.
