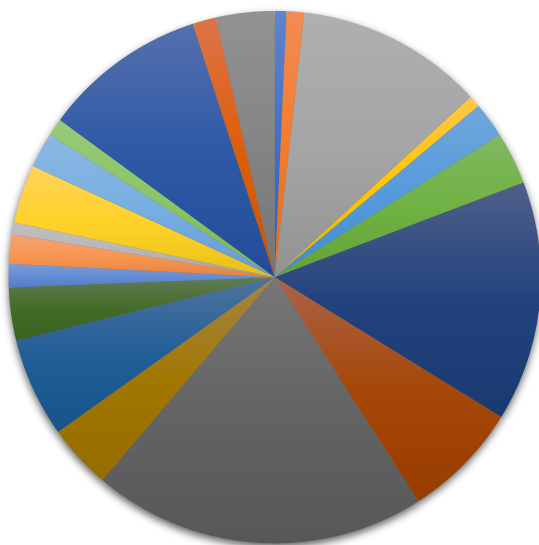
SCHOOL MOTTO:
